


Harvest Festival Celebration

School Photographs (Individual & Siblings)



Feedback from RE Questionnaire




St Stephen's Primary School has a strong Christian ethos.


St Stephen's Primary School has a set of clear and explicit Christian values.


The Christian ethos supports the spiritual and moral development of your child(ren) and all other learners in the school


The school has high expectations of behaviour that reflects its Christian values.


Collective Worship is important in the life of the school.








