Summer Reading Challenge

The Summer Reading Challenge is a national initiative that helps boost children's reading skills and confidence while encouraging a lifelong love of reading. The programme runs throughout the holidays and is open to all children aged 4–11. Younger children can also take part via the **Mini Challenge** collecting stickers and a certificate of completion. The Summer Reading Challenge encourages children to use the library to borrow books so this is a wonderful way to enjoy a variety of books without spending a penny. If you do not yet have a library card, please apply for one at your local library. The children will be asked to tell the librarian a little bit about the book that they have read and will be rewarded with stickers and a small prize. If children complete the Summer Reading Challenge (all six books) then they will receive a certificate and possibly a golden ticket to book in for a special celebration event at **Broadway Theatre** on **29th October 2026**. Young children (age 0-4) who want to take part in the **Mini Challenge** will take part in age-appropriate challenges and tips informed by REAL principles (Raising Early Achievement in Literacy). It offers a fun and engaging way for families to support their child's love of books, plus their early reading and writing skills this summer. We would love for as many children as possible to take part in this rewarding challenge so that we can celebrate how wonderful it is to be able to read and share books with one another.
